DAODS Newsletter: Issue 4

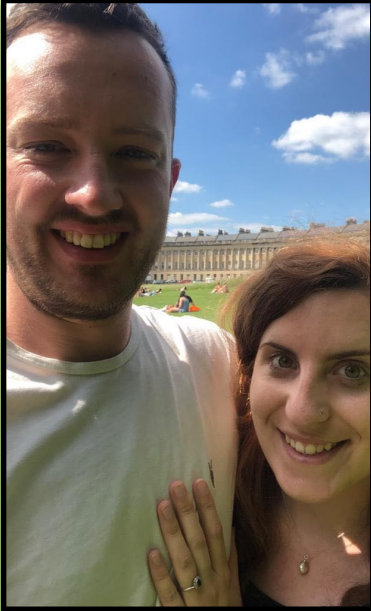

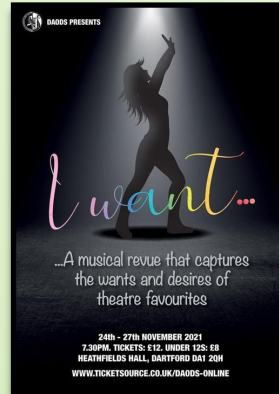

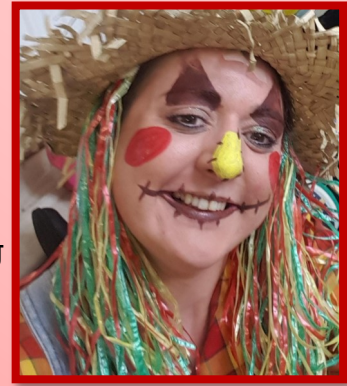
